# Chicago Chapter Recognizes July 4

#### **American Independence Day 2022**

The Chicago Chapter of AVER celebrated July 4 by placement of a wreath at the AVER Veterans Monument at the NW corner of Addison and Halsted. Larry Simpson, Chicago Chapter Treasurer, and Bruce Inman, AVER member, posed for the wreath laying this year. The Halsted Monument was unveiled and dedicated five years ago in 2017. At the dedication of the Halsted memorial, U.S. Representative Jan Schakowsky noted that "Every veteran should be remembered and honored for their service," and Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel wrote that the monument is "a tribute to the sacrifice of our solders." A second Chicago area memorial is housed at the Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery in Elwood, IL, near Joliet, and was erected and dedicated by the Chicago Chapter of AVER in 2015. Only a handful of memorials commemorate the service and sacrifice of LGBTQ+ veterans and armed forces servicemembers, so we are very proud to have two of these sites in the Chicago area.

July 4 commemorates the passage of the Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress in 1776 and the political separation of the thirteen colonies from Great Britain. On July 4, 1965, forty gay and lesbian activists held the first Annual Reminder demonstration in Philadelphia, PA, in front of Independence Hall to recognize the inequality of civil rights afforded the LGBT community at that time. **Frank Kameny** and **Barbara Gittings** were the principal organizers of that event, and it was a precursor to the Stonewall Rebellion of 1969 that ignited the LGBT movement across the country. You have a double incentive to celebrate on the Fourth of July!!

### **No-Fee Chicago City Parking Sticker**

On July 20, the Chicago City Council voted to pass and codify the City Clerk's No-Fee Veterans City Sticker pilot into a permanent program that now also includes small trucks. Veterans who have a "Veteran" designation of their Illinois Driver's License or IL State ID are eligible to receive a free Vehicle City Sticker for a vehicle designated as either a Passenger (P), Large Passenger (LP), Motorbike (MB), or Small Truck (ST). Veterans with Prisoner of War (PW), Purple-Heart Recipient (PR), I-Served (IS), or Disabled Veteran (DV) license plates will continue to be eligible for the program. The Chicago Chapter of AVER supported this program, and provided quidance and a letter of support to rally for this program. Anna Valencia, City Clerk, and Jorge Ramirez, Deputy Chief Operating Officer, recognized and thanked the Chicago Chapter of AVER for their support. "I'm thrilled that we are making the No-Fee Veterans City Sticker option permanent," said Clerk Valencia. "Our goal at the Office of the City Clerk is to serve as the link between communities and government. We are here to create policies that are inclusive for all our residents—especially our nation's heroes. As leaders, we should always be looking for small and big ways to honor our veterans." City Council Chair Walter Burnett noted that "This expansion represents one less barrier for those that deserve it the most, our veterans. Veterans can at times face financial difficulties and employment barriers. I applaud Clerk Valencia's work to help our nation's heroes across the services they need, all while honoring them." Alderman Gilbert Villegas, 36th Ward, stated "I am proud to be a long-time supporter of this ordinance, and to finally see the No-Fee Veterans City Sticker option formally implemented. It's policies like these that provide some relief to our residents in these unprecedented times, especially for our brave men and women that have sacrificed so much for our city and country." Implementation took effect immediately.

#### SNAP!

SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits millions of adults and families every year, including individuals who have served in the U.S. military. In 2019 alone, SNAP-participating households included over one million veterans. The number of qualifying individuals is probably even higher when you consider that 7% of the adult U.S. population, 18M, are veterans with a median age of 65; post 9/11-veterans experience a 43% chance of having a service-related disability, often rely on a fixed monthly income, and are therefore probably eligible for program assistance. The food pantry at JBVAMC is currently closed, due to the pandemic, but those eligible are encouraged to apply for SNAP benefits. # Do you suffer from food insecurity?

You are not alone, 1.5 million Veterans live below the federal poverty level (FPL). You may be eligible for USDA's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

## What is SNAP?

SNAP offers monthly benefits on an electronic benefit transfer (EBT) card in order to help you provide food for you and your family. SNAP is used by over 1 million veterans.

## Who is eligible to receive SNAP benefits?

Most households with low income qualify for SNAP benefits.

# Are my veteran's benefits counted as income for SNAP eligibility?

Yes, most earned and unearned income is counted. Examples of countable income are:

- Wages
- Self-employment earnings
- Rental income
- Social Security benefits
- Veterans benefits (Retirement, Disability, GI Bill)
