

LGBTQ Rights under Attack in 2023

In the last few years, there has been a record number of state bills that attack LGBTQ rights, especially those rights of transgender youth. While more states work to pass laws to protect LGBTQ people, many states are drafting bills that target transgender people, limit local protections, and allow the use of religion to discriminate. At present, there are over 230 anti-LGBTQ bills being considered in state legislatures. Some bills (e.g., Indiana HB 1524 or SB 351, Texas SB 162, Utah SB93, Tennessee HB 239) attempt to limit the ability to update gender information on IDs, birth certificates, and driver's licenses, and puts transgender people at risk of losing jobs

and facing harassment. Others attempt to undermine or weaken nondiscrimination laws by allowing employers, businesses, and hospitals to turn away LGBTQ people (e.g., Arizona SB 1001, Oklahoma HB 2186, Texas HB 319, New Jersey A 328), prevent trans students from participating in school activities, force teachers to out students, and censor any in-school discussions of LGBTQ people and issues (e.g., Connecticut HB 6213, Arkansas HB 1156), prohibit transgender people from using public facilities like bathrooms and locker rooms, and other bans. from the Ohio State University, and a Diversity and Inclusion certificate from Cornell University. Upon her appointment as Executive Director, he noted that "We've come so far and achieved so much thanks to the selfless advocates who never gave up in their fight to overturn discriminatory policies and ensure today's modern military families have the support they deserve. With so much left to accomplish, I'm proud to lead this organization forward and double down in our incredibly important work to support and defend the LGBTQ military and veteran community." International Holocaust Remembrance Day

On January 27, the German Parliament focused, for the first time, on people persecuted and killed over their sexual or gender identity during World War II. Germany's Lesbian and Gay Association rights group welcomed Friday's ceremony, calling it an "important symbol of recognition" of the "suffering and the dignity of the imprisoned, tortured, and murdered victims." Chancellor Olaf Scholz noted that "The suffering of six million innocently murdered Jews is unforgotten—as is the suffering of the survivors."

Federal Evidence Agenda on LGBTQI+ Equity

In late January, the White House released the first-ever *Federal Evidence Agenda on Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, and Intersex (LGBTQI+) Equity,* a roadmap that federal agencies will use to ensure they are collecting the data and evidence they need to improve the lives of LGBTQI+ Americans. This Evidence Agenda (EA) delivers on the commitment made by President Biden in a June 2022 Executive Order on LGBTQI+ equality, and is an important step forward in the Administration's work to expand the federal collection of data about sexual orientation, gender identity, and sex characteristics—so-called "SOGI data"—and advance equity for LGBTQI+ Americans. The Biden Administration has made significant progress to advance full inclusion and equal protection for LGBTQI+ Americans but has been hampered by incomplete information on the number of LGBTQI+ people in the U.S., their experiences engaging with federal agencies, and the disparities they face in their daily lives. The EA includes an overview of the impact of gaps in SOGI data, specific questions to consider that will improve the health and well-being of LGBTQI+ people, and guidelines on collecting SOGI data. This builds on efforts by the WH to augment the Census Bureau's American Community Survey with questions about LGBTQI+ Americans, release of a survey on the high rates of economic, housing, and food insecurity that LGBTQI+ households faced during the COVID-19 pandemic, and offering passports with "X" gender markers and allowing all Americans to accurately provide personal gender identity information on federal forms.
